Possible additions or substitutions:

Several wild petunias (*Ruellia humilis*) – purple, and/or  
 Purple poppy mallow (*Callirhoe involucrata*) – magenta  
 could be planted among the plants along the edges. These are  
 trailing plants and will fill in spaces between others. They have a long bloom period.

Slender Mountain Mint (*Pycnanthemum tenuifolium*) - white  
 Foxglove Penstemon (*Penstemon digitalis*) - white  
 Wild Lupine (*Lupinus perennis*) - purple  
 Anise Hyssop (*Agastache perennis*) - purple  
 Stiff Goldenrod (*Solidago rigida*) - yellow  
 Hoary Vervain (*Verbena stricta*) - purple  
 Additional milkweed species (appropriate for mesic/dry planting)  
 Lead Plant (*Amorpha canescens*) - purple
